STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE & MANAGEMENT

The Charity was established in 1998 and is governed by, and in accordance with, its constitution which was reviewed and updated in February 2020. The updated constitution document was approved by OSCR in March 2020.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects of the Charity are to raise funds to pay the fees charged (or associated costs incurred) by Perth & Kinross Council for instrumental music tuition fees, and/or attendance at Central Groups. We aim to fund fees charged to young musicians across the Perth & Kinross Council area who come from financially challenged families, and support the Instrumental Music Service to provide music tuition for all Perth & Kinross school children. To further these objects, we aim to obtain grant funding (where possible), seek donations, and organise fund raising events. In January 2019, Trustees agreed to establish a Reserve Fund up to an initial maximum value of £25,000 to meet unanticipated future events. The full Policy is set out on page 8 of this document.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Fund raising events generated £0 (2023 £zero). **Gift Aid Recovered** from HMRC totalled £163 (2023 £646). **Donations** received amounted to £1,932 (2023 £652). **Grants** received from Trusts/Awarding Bodies totalled £0 (2023 £zero).

During the year, **grants** totalling £18,790 (2023 £14,999) were paid out. This sum covered the grant paid to the Instrumental Music Service to support the increase in young people applying for tuition, following the abolition of fees by the Scottish Government from August 2021. Perth & Kinross Council has confirmed that music tuition fees were formally abolished by them from August 2022.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The net outgoing resources for the year ended 30 June 2024 were £15,651 (2023 outgoing £13,226).

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF PERTH & KINROSS MUSIC FOUNDATION

I have examined the Management Committee's report, the Charity's accounting records, the Receipts and Payments Account, the Statement of Balances, and the attached notes for the year ended 30 June 2024 of Perth & Kinross Music Foundation (Charity Number SCO 27457) as set on pages 5 to 8 of this report.

RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEES AND EXAMINER

The Charity's Trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) 2005 Act, and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The Charity Trustees consider that the audit requirements of Regulation 10(1) (a-c) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as prepared under section 44(1)(C) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

BASIS OF INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. This examination included a review of the accounting records kept by the Charity, and a comparison of the accounts presented from those records. I also included consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and sought explanations from the Trustees concerning such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently, no opinion is given as to whether these accounts present a "true and fair view", and this report is limited only to those matters set out in the statements below.

STAFF COSTS AND EMOLUMENTS

No salaries or wages have been paid to employees, including members of the committee.

4 RESERVE FUND

In January 2019, Trustees agreed to establish a Reserve Fund to cater for any unexpected increase in applications for financial assistance, and/or a reduction in income from fund raising activities, and/or grant awarding bodies. The maximum amount to be held at any one time was initially agreed as £25,000. The full Reserves Policy approved by Trustees is published on the following page. This was reviewed at the Foundation's AGM in August 2023 and no changes were made. There were no sums transferred to the Reserve Fund during the current year.

PERTH & KINROSS MUSIC FOUNDATION - RESERVES POLICY

The undernoted reserves policy was approved by Trustees at their meeting on 8 January 2019.

Description of the charity, its beneficiaries, and its funding streams.

Perth & Kinross Music Foundation was established in January 1998 to help advance the instrumental music education of the pupils of Perth & Kinross schools. The beneficiaries of the Foundation's activities will be families from low income households across Perth & Kinross, whose children are accessing either individual instrumental music tuition and/or participating in Central Group activities organised by Perth & Kinross Council Instrumental Music Service. In addition, the Foundation will provide assistance to the Instrumental Music Service itself by way of a grant to cover the costs of educational resources to support the continued provision of instrumental music tuition. The charity will raise funds via locally organised fundraising events, seeking donations from individual and group sponsors/supporters, and applying to grant awarding bodies (both nationally and locally) which support the promotion and provision of music tuition/education for young people.

The rationale behind the reserves policy.

The purpose of this reserves policy will be to secure the future sustainability of the Foundation's finances in the event of unanticipated levels of applications for financial support, and/or a reduction in funding secured from grant awarding bodies, or from our own fundraising events and supporters.

Steps taken to establish the level of reserves.

The Trustees have considered the various issues surrounding whether or not a reserve fund is necessary, and have reached the conclusion that it would be financially prudent to establish a reserve fund to ensure financial sustainability for at least one year's operations, thus allowing Trustees to review activities and take appropriate action to respond, should any of the above events materialise.

The level of reserves to be held.

An initial maximum of £25,000, was agreed to be set aside incrementally as finances allow over the coming years.

How and when the Reserves Policy will be reviewed.

This Reserves Policy, and the balance to be held in the reserve fund, will be reviewed by Trustees annually at The Foundation's Annual General Meeting.
